Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) has released new accountability information for each public school system in the state, including the Star ratings for individual schools. These new Star Ratings are calculated using 2022-2023 school year accountability data.

Since 2017-2018, the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) has reported on accountability components outlined in the Maryland Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) Plan, which evaluates school systems and individual schools on a set of criteria.

Coming in as the number one elementary school in the state of Maryland, and as the number three school in the state, <u>out of 1,400 elementary, middle, and high schools</u> (two specialty high schools tied as number one) is, drum roll please, West Towson Elementary School. 

NEWS FROM MRS. VANDERWAL- HEARING AND VISION SCREENING

Baltimore County Department of Hearing and Vision will screen our students in pre-kindergarten, kindergarten, and grades 1st and 4th on January 17 - 22. Any students new to Baltimore County Public Schools will also be screened. If you have a student in these grades, be sure that they bring their glasses to school for the screening exam. Teachers and parents may refer students from other grades for screening by contacting Ms. van der Wal. If you do not want your child screened, please notify the school prior to the screening dates.



Parents of students who fail the hearing and vision screening will be notified by letter. This letter should be taken to the doctor who provides the follow-up exam and then sent back to school with the results of the exam. If you are notified that your child failed the screening please make every effort to have your doctor or eye doctor examine your child promptly. BALTIMORE COUNTY PUBLIC SCHOOLS SUMMER LEARNING 2024

As we enter the second marking period, Baltimore County Public Schools have already started planning for summer learning in 2024. As we work to increase achievement for all students by providing a variety of pathways to prepare students for college and careers, students who require additional learning at the end of the 2023-2024 school year will need to attend a summer program to help them

be successful in the next grade level. Additional information about summer program offerings will be shared with students and families throughout the school year.

Below is a list of resources and supports that you and your student should consider accessing throughout the next three marking periods in order to maximize academic success in the 2023-2024 school year.



- Set up daily or weekly "Parent Digest" notifications from Schoology to monitor your student's activity in each class. Directions for setting up notifications can be found here.
- · All students and families can access Amira practice for additional opportunities to practice foundational skills. Families/students can access the Amira Reading practice through the HMH Into Reading app on the My Apps portal.
- Bridges Family Support- The Math Learning Center offers additional activities and games by grade level to support student skill building and fluency. Families can access the website on our BCPS Office of Mathematics website.
- · Family Resources by Unit- The purpose of these resources is to provide unit overviews with models (videos and samples) to support homework and suggestions for families to engage in real-world application of the mathematics skills and strategies with their students. Families can access these resources through the BCPS Office of Mathematics website or through their child's math course in Schoology.
- · Math Homework Helpers- Math Homework Helpers is a resource provided on BCPS TV those models strategies for problem solving aligned with elementary math standards. All episodes of Math Homework Helpers are archived and available through YouTube and are also linked in the Family Resource Unit Overviews available on the BCPS Office of Mathematics website.
- · Special Education- Progress reports are completed at the end of each quarter for each student receiving special education services. If a student is not making progress, the IEP team must meet. Families can work with the IEP team/SST to review accommodations and modifications if additional support is needed.
- ESOL- Office of ESOL support for students and families includes SEL support. Trauma-informed professional learning has been offered in the summer of 2023 and will be offered again throughout the school year. Families/students can request additional support from Administrators, counselors and the BCPS ESOL Office and ESOL Welcome Center upon enrollment.
- ESOL (3-12)- Infercabulary- Online platform using semantic reasoning with visual support to develop academic vocabulary. Students can access this program through Schoology or the BCPS Apps Portal

NEW/GENTLY USED SOCCER EQUIPMENT DRIVE: NEWS FROM CHUCK YANNEY



Absence Policy: A student absent from school shall present a note immediately upon return to school. The note, signed by the parent/guardian, shall include the name of the student, the date of, and the reason for the absence no later than five days after the student's return to school. If a student is absent for an extended period of time due to illness (greater than 3 consecutive days), a written statement of explanation from the physician is required no later than five days after the student's return to class.
